The success of our 'Supporting One-person Rule' depends on our ability to prevent the spread of COVID-19 through the community.

COORDINATION & COMMUNICATION

It is very important that we use our formal channels of communication so that we can have one source of reliable information.

Those formal lines of communication are your Direct Coordinator during the day, and the On-call Telephone after hours.
